

Dispur March To-day

GUWAHATI, Jan. 3--The Executive committee members of the AASU and AAGSP will march to Dispur to-morrow, defying 144 Cr. P. C. to submit a memorandum to the Chief Secretary to the Government of Assam demanding stoppage of atrocities by police and CRP on people and Government employees. This is the part of the month-long agitation chalked out jointly by the AASU and AAGSP to be rounded off with the dawn to dusk 'Assam Curfew' on January 26.

According to a statement issued by Sri Biraj Sarma, one of the convenors of the AAGSP, the Executive members will march to Dispur at 10 am from the Central office of the AAGSP.

PTI adds: The Assam Government tonight warned that any violation of the prohibitory order, now in force in the State, would be firmly dealt with.

The government was, however, ready to meet any delegation of Assam movement leaders, the Chief Secretary, Sri Ramesh Chandra said, while making clear the Government stand on the current movement, on foreign national issue.

The warning came in the wake of the AASU and AAGSP's decision to take out a 'march to Dispur' procession tomorrow to submit to the Governor's advisers a memorandum demanding early solution to the foreigners issue and withdrawal of 'repressive measures'.

THE ALL ASSAM STUDENTS' UNION HAS ASKED THE PEOPLE IN THE STATE TO KEEP THEIR SHOPS AND MARKETS AND FACTORIES CLOSED TO-MORROW FROM 5 AM TO 5 PM AND NOT TO LIGHT LAMPS AND ELECTRIC BULBS THROUGHOUT THE NIGHT IN PROTEST AGAINST GOVERNMENT CARNAGE AND TO PAY HOMAGE TO THE MARTYRS WHO FELL TO POLICE AND CRP BULLETS IN NOWGONG AND TEZPUR DURING THE ROAD BLOCKADE PROGRAMME.

During the 36-hour road blockade programme that ended at 5 pm on the New Year day, police and CRP opened fire at Dimow and Bhakatgaon in Nowgong district and Tezpur and Biswanath Chariali in Darrang district killing seven indigenous young men and injuring about 100 others. Those who were killed are: Swahid Naren Nath, Rajib Rajkumar, Bhudhar Deka, Atul Muktiar, Anukul Kakati, Rupak Nath and Manjit Das.

The blackout during night to-

morrow has been organised to pay tributes to those martyrs who sacrificed their lives in brutal killings by police and CRP. The AASU has asked the people to enforce blackout treating to-morrow as the black day.

In a statement issued from the AASU headquarter, Sri Prafulla Kumar Mahanta, President of AASU and Sri Bhrija Kumar Phukan, General Secretary, AASU, said that in repugnance to the democratic tradition and dignity of law, the Government killed seven persons and crippled for life many more. Although the Government of India has announced a tripartite talks, nothing has been informed to the AASU as yet.

Sri Mahanta and Sri Phukan have appealed to the people to make the current agitational programme a success.

The Purbanchaliya Loka Parishad has earnestly appealed to the people of Assam to observe the Protest Day to-morrow at the call of the AASU and AAGSP in the memory of the 'Swahids' and against the brutal killings and Lathicharges by the 'Government's forces'.

FASCIST FORCES

In a statement issued to the Press, appealing to the people to observe the 'Protest Day', the PLP says 'the Government, by its fascist forces has been trying to stop the democratic voices of the people of Assam. The Assamese people have been shot and lathicharged because they have enormous faith in the constitution and democratic ideals. They have been considered criminals because they are patriots and they are fighting for the safety and security of the sovereignty of the country'
