

Civil Disobedience

GUWAHATI Jan 9—The 36-hour Civil Disobedience programme at the call of the the AASU and AAGSP will commence tomorrow at 5 am and end at 5 pm of January 11. During the programme hours people are asked to travel in government buses ferries and trains without ticket. The cine goers are asked not to pay amusement taxes during those 36 hours of Civil Disobedience.

The month long agitational programme will be rounded off with the "Assam Curfew" to be imposed by the AASU and AAGSP on January 26, when people will have to keep indoors during the dawn to dusk curfew on that day.

The All Assam Students Union has appealed to the people to travel in train bus and ferries without buying ticket and also not to buy postage stamps and make any financial transactions in post offices on January 10 and 11. The AASU has requested the cinegoers not to pay amusement tax. It advised the mass agitators to agree to be arrested as and when the police forces try to arrest them.

In a statement issued by the AASU President, Sri Prafulla Kumar Mahanta and General Secretary Sri Bhrigu Kumar Phukan extended full support to the call given by the Coordination Committee of the All Assam Karmachari Parishad

Clarification By

GUWAHATI, Jan. 9—The Coordination Committee of Karmachari Parishad in a statement to the Press, issued here today, clarified that during the non-cooperation programme, on November 12, all the employees, workers, teachers and officers will remain absent from their duties.

The Parishad once again appealed to the employees to remain vigilant against the divisive forces that may try to disturb the peace and tranquility during the period of non-cooperation.

PTI adds: The Assam Government today warned that any attempt to board public transports including buses trains and ferries or enter cinema houses without tickets during the two-day Civil Disobedience Movement in the State from tomorrow would be dealt with under the provision of law.

The Government warning came in the wake of the Assam agitation leaders call for a two-day 'Civil Disobedience' movement beginning from tomorrow as part of their current agitation on foreign nationals issue.

Meanwhile adequate precautionary measures have been taken by the law enforcing authorities against any breach of law during the period according to a Government Press Release.
