



(one hundred) families left their homes for Mizoram after the incident of 16th January 2006, out of these families about 40 (forty) have returned back to their home till now. All these families took shelter at relief centre camp at Sakawrdai, Mizoram.

I cannot say about the circumstances leading to the incident of 16th Jan. 2006. I cannot say whether the incident was pre-planned or whether it was done on spur of the moment.

As regards measures for preventing re-occurrence of such incidence in future, being a Police Office, I can only suggest that Police force which is short of man power throughout the whole state of Manipur, should be strengthened to its full capacities. I suggest that presently the strength of the security personnel be increased to cover the whole area in my district Churachandpur. We keep on receiving that many parts of Churachandpur district are inhabitat by the insurgents. I do not know if the villagers of Parbung, etc. are afraid to come to district headquarters because of fear for the insurgents. Such things are not reported to us by the villagers out of fear or reprisal. Recently, 60 (sixty) new securities as constable have been placed under me. They are undergoing training. This is not all sufficient to maintain law and order in the district. Recently, two battalions of constable numbering roughly 1800/1900 by the centre for the state of Manipur. Recruitments have already been made and their training is going on. So, I suggest that some of the new IRB Riflemen after the training, should be placed at my disposal to work with the Army personnel.

The Home Ministry and the Defence Ministry of the central government posted Army Units in our district. Presently, there are four companies at Parbung. So far my knowledge goes each company consist of 90-100 personnel. This is not sufficient considering the terrain of that area.

**XXX (Comments for .....**

I am quite aware of the provision of law as containing chapter 6 of CRPC Police Officers superior in rank to an OC of a Police Station may exercise the same powers throughout the local area to which they are appointed as may be exercised by such OC within the limits of his station. I had no prior reports and the presence of UGs at Parbung and Lungthulien before the alleged incident of 16th Jan., 2006. I cannot now remember which newspaper and a date on which I read the news too. Perhaps, it was Sangai Express. .... It is believed that the Arm Forces Special Powers Act, 1958 is in power for the last about 50 years. I came to the Police service of Manipur in the early part of 2001. I cannot say whether Central Para Military Forces including the Army have been deployed throughout the hill districts of Manipur, Continuously, *since the year 1980* ..... *including*... Lungthulien and Parbung village.

It is true that entire state of Manipur had been declared as disturbed area. As far as I know for Churachandpur district, when I joined only CRPF, Police and one company of IRB men have been deployed. One training centre of BSF was also there. One person H.T. Gangte, IPS, was the SDPO and incharge of Parbung P.S. and Thanlon Sub-division at the time of the alleged occurance.

The SDPO as the I.O. of the said FIR cases has already recorded the statements of most of the alleged victims and again of the alleged incidents. As far as I know, statements of only two victims were recorded under Section 164CRPC by a Judicial Magistrate first class Bishnupur. Only one of the alleged victim has been Medical Examined in Churachandpur. Some other alleged victims are done at Aizawl. The total strength of Manipur Police Personnel so far posted in my Churachandpur district at a relevant time of the incident is about 220 (two hundred twenty). There was no report received by me from any of the villagers at Parbung and nearby villages about their fearness of coming to district headquarter, Churachandpur because of the insurgents. The villagers were not submitting any reports about the presence of the insurgents out of fear of reprisal. I do not admit that my last statement that villagers do not submit their report for fear of reprisal by the UGs is false.

I do not admit whatever I learned about any of the alleged incident of 16th January 2006 as stated by me in my examination in-chief have been fabricated and concocted from some quarters to create mis-understandings among the different community in the state.

**XXX (Counsel for MAFIF)**

The OC Parbung reached Parbung in the last part of January 2006, but I cannot say the exact date of his reaching time. I cannot confirm without referring to the records as regards the endorsement of the copies of the FIRs to the concerned Magistrate in complain with section 15 of CRPC. I deny the suggestion that all the FRSs mentioned in my in-chief are concocted and fabricated.
